## AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF JUDICIAL ACADEMY, JHARKHAND

The Judicial Academy, Jharkhand was established on 04/01/2002 at Ranchi, on the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India passed in "All India Judges Case" reported in 2002 (4) SCC 247, under the patronage of Hon'ble Mr. Justice V.K. Gupta, the first Chief Justice of High Court of Jharkhand. It was initially situated in the part building of Shri Krishna Institute of Public Administration (SKIPA) at Meur's Road, Ranchi. In the year 2015 new building of Judicial Academy Jharkhand was inaugurated by Hon'ble Mr. Justice Tirath Singh Thakur, the then Judge of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India on 10/10/2015 in a picturesque location near the sprawling Dhurwa Dam of Ranchi. The Academy is equipped with the latest state-of-the-art facilities.

The aim and objectives of Judicial Academy, Jharkhand as reflected through Gazette notification dated 7th March, 2002 is to impart continuous training to in-service judicial officers of Jharkhand state, such persons who have been selected, proposed or recommended for appointment as officers in the Jharkhand Judicial Service, the members of the Registry of the Jharkhand High Court and the ministerial staff of the Hon'ble High Court and State Judiciary.

The Academy also aims to enhance competency of the Judicial Officers, Prosecutors and Advocates by imparting trainings to them in bringing qualitative improvement for dispensation of quality justice and to equip them with the requisite operational skills, tools and techniques for speedy trial in order to overcome hindrances causing delay, through various judicial training programmes and specially designed courses with a view to improve quality and quantity of their output. In order to achieve its objectives, the Academy also impart trainings to the in-service Government officers, Police officers and persons from civil societies.

The purpose behind judicial training is not only to enhance legal knowledge or judicial skills but also to develop skills, knowledge, work

culture and to reinforce ethical standards such as discipline, etiquette, attitude and moral values such as integrity, impartiality etc. in decision-making among the Judicial Officers and all stakeholders attached to the Justice delivery system necessary for effective judicial performance. One of the purposes of the Academy is also to sensitize the Judicial officers and other stake holders to protect the right of weaker or vulnerable and marginalised sections of the society to build public trust in the judiciary through transparency and accountability towards the society.

Academy also provides the participants a forum to discuss on various issues, share experiences, new ideas, difficulties, besides problem solving and exchange of best practices. There is special emphasis in the training courses on providing space for interactive sessions, panel discussions, group presentations etc. to the participants for their all-around development.

Academy organizes regional conferences, state level conferences, workshops, symposia on various relevant topics and special training programmes on specific contemporary legal issues for the Judicial officers and other relevant stakeholders to update them with the changing laws, new laws, such as e-laws, cyber-crimes, electronic evidence, e-data, cyber forensic, medical forensic as well as programmes on Information and Communication Technology. The main purpose is to keep the Judicial officers and other stake holders abreast with use of latest technologies in legal fields for efficient case management and court administration. The Academy has a vast panel of dedicated resource persons from diverse fields besides legal experts such as experts from medical, forensic, cyber, etc. who are enriching the trainees with their knowledge and experiences. Apart from that the Academy also organizes courses or classes on CIS to make all the Judicial Officers accustomed with National Judicial Data Grid and equip them with Court Management skills.

Academy even organizes programmes for mental and physical well-being of the officers' health through stress management sessions, Yoga classes, etc. in order to enhance their capacities to discharge their duties effectively and enthusiastically.

Judicial Academy Jharkhand, takes all the positive and effective steps to bring about closer levels of interactions between the members of the Bar and the Bench and for that Academy also organizes number of Seminars, Symposia and Workshops throughout the year. Apart from that the Academy is also engaged in continuous research works on relevant topics through its dedicated Research Scholars.
